Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts for the period ended 31 March 2014**1 Accounting Policies****Basis of measurement and preparation of accounts**

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities effective April 2008.

Turnover policy

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of sales made during the year and derives from the provision of goods falling within the company's ordinary activities.

Tangible assets depreciation policy

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 25% reducing balance

Motor vehicles - 25% reducing balance

Other accounting policies

Leasing and hire purchase commitments.

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce constant periodic rates of charge on the net obligations outstanding in each period.

Stock.

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Going concern.

The balance sheet shows that liabilities exceed assets by £19,560. The director has confirmed his intention to maintain his financial support for the foreseeable future to enable the company to continue normal trading operations. These accounts are therefore drawn up on a going concern basis.
