DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1 APRIL 2013 TO 31 DECEMBER 2013

The Directors present their report, together with the audited financial statements, for the period 1 April 2013 to 31 December 2013.

The Directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies entitled to the small companies' exemption.

Principal activities and review of developments

PPH Limited, the immediate parent company of The Corre Partnership Holdings Limited, was acquired by Willis Limited on 18 June 2013.

The Company acts as a holding company and on 18 June 2013 became an indirect subsidiary of Willis Group Holdings plc ('the Group'), following the acquisition on that date by Willis Limited of 100% of the shares in PPH Limited, the Company's immediate parent company.

The Group is one of the world's leading professional service providers of risk management solutions, risk transfer expertise through insurance and reinsurance broking, and related specialised consultancy services.

The comparative period represents results from 29 November 2011 (the date of incorporation) through to 31 March 2013.

During the period the Company changed its reporting period end from 31 March to 31 December, to align with other Group companies.

Results

The result on ordinary activities after taxation amounted to nil (period to 31 March 2013: £10,500) as shown in the profit and loss account on page 7. The loss to 31 March 2013 represented a write down in the cost of investment in a subsidiary undertaking of £8,500 and audit fees of £2,000. For the period 1 April 2013 to 31 December 2013 audit fees were borne by another group Company.

The Directors do not anticipate any changes in the Company's position for the foreseeable future.

Going concern

The Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in note 1 to the financial statements on page 10.

Dividends

No interim dividend was paid during the period (period to 31 March 2013: £nil). The Directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend (period to 31 March 2013: £nil).

Directors

The current Directors of the Company are shown on page 1, which forms part of this report. G Aguilar-Millan and T Smyth resigned as Director of the Company on 18 June 2013. N Perry and P Owens were appointed with effect from 18 June 2013. There were no other changes in Directors during the period or after the period end.

Statement of Directors' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period. Under that law, the Directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law, the Directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the profit or loss of the Company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Disclosure of information to the auditor

Each of the persons who is a Director at the date of approval of this report confirms that:


- so far as the Director is aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the Company's auditor is unaware; and

- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.



The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the period and the preceding period.

The financial statements have been prepared:

- under the historical cost convention; and
- in accordance with applicable law and accounting standards in the United Kingdom.

After making enquiries, the Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The expectation is based on the following reasons:

- the Directors believe the Willis Group is a going concern.
- while the Company has net current liabilities of £10,500 (31 March 2013: £10,500) this amount is attributable to a net intercompany creditor. If the Company were required to settle these creditor balances, the Group would provide alternative funding.

For this reason, the Directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the accounts.

Parent undertaking and controlling party

The Company's:

- immediate parent company and controlling undertaking is PPH Limited; and
- ultimate parent company is Willis Group Holdings plc, a company incorporated in Ireland.

In accordance with Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006, the Company is exempt from the requirement to produce group financial statements.

The largest and smallest group in which the results of the Company are consolidated is Willis Group Holdings plc, whose financial statements are available to members of the public from the Company Secretary, 51 Lime Street, London EC3M 7DQ.

Fixed asset investments

Investments in subsidiaries are carried at cost less provision for impairment.

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid or recovered using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Cash flow statement

Under FRS1 'Cash flow statements' the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that the Company is a 90 per cent or more owned subsidiary undertaking and the consolidated cash flow statement that is prepared at Group level is publicly available.

(c) Circumstances affecting current and future tax charges

The Finance Act 2012, which was substantively enacted on 3 July 2012, included provisions to reduce the rate of UK corporation tax to 24% with effect from 1 April 2012 and to 23% with effect from 1 April 2013.

The main rate of UK corporation tax was further reduced to 21% with effect from 1 April 2014 and to 20% with effect from 1 April 2015. These changes to the main tax rate were included in the Finance Act 2013 which was substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. As the changes were substantively enacted prior to 31 December 2013, they have been reflected in these financial statements.
